


Arthrogryposis multiplex congenita*

- AMC is a rare sporadic nonprogressive congenital disorder that is characterized by multiple joint contractures and can incorporate muscle weakness and fibrosis
- Multiple contractures in general and AMC more specifically are a common ultrasound finding
- Neurogenic, or myopathy disorder, connective tissue process, intrauterine compression, vascular compromise, or teratogenic exposure could be the principal cause of the ultrasound finding
- Better understanding of this clinical situation offers an opportunity for careful prenatal assessment through thorough image scanning focusing on flexion/extension, position of proximal and distal joints, jaw, and spine
- When prenatal diagnosis is suspected families should be counseled for potential postnatal or post term evaluation
