Answer Chondroblastoma

 Typically affects epiphyses. Apophysis or sesamoid bone (epiphyseal equivalents) may be affected

- ✓ Radiographic features usually suggest slow growth
- MRI shows what may be interpreted as "inflammatory" features - marrow/soft tissue oedema & joint effusion.
